Scripture:

A debate broke out between John's disciples and a certain Jew over ceremonial cleansing. So John's disciples came to him and said, "Rabbi, the man you met on the other side of the Jordan River, the one you identified as the Messiah, is also baptizing people. And everybody is going to him instead of coming to us."

John replied, "No one can receive anything unless God gives it from heaven. You yourselves know how plainly I told you, 'I am not the Messiah. I am only here to prepare the way for him.' It is the bridegroom who marries the bride, and the bridegroom's friend is simply glad to stand with him and hear his vows. Therefore, I am filled with joy at his success. He must become greater and greater, and I must become less and less.

Introduction & Icebreaker (10 minutes)

- Keep learning names and helping people feel welcome! As you answer the opening question, introduce yourself with your name.
- What's one thing everyone knows about you and one thing not everyone knows about you?

Message & Scripture Discussion (30 minutes)

• What stood out to you from Sunday's service? How did you sense God at work in you through the songs, the story video, the message, and being together with others as part of the church? (The message main points and scripture are listed below if it helps you think back.)

- In the sermon, Eddie talked about John the Baptist as someone whose purpose and job description was to introduce Jesus. **Have someone read John 3:25-30** out loud. **What do you notice about John the Baptist in these verses?**
- Eddie also shared the story from the Old Testament of King Nebuchadnezzar in Daniel 4. Have someone read Daniel 4:28-32 out loud. What do you notice about Nebuchadnezzar? What do you notice about God?
- In the message, Eddie listed several tendencies to watch out for in ourselves. Read through this list and note if anything stands out to you in particular:
 - Insisting on credit making sure our contribution is noticed and acknowledged
 - Religious lingo propping ourselves up or making ourselves seem more knowledgeable or important with spiritual words
 - Self-justification finding technicalities or loopholes to excuse our behavior (rather than confess and own our mistake)
 - Harsh judgement of others focusing on others behavior instead of our own
 - Self-loathing chronic insecurity or putting ourselves down when we compare ourselves to others

Which one of these do you most struggle with? Are there certain situations or relationships where you struggle with making yourself bigger and more important?

- **Have someone read these words from Jesus out loud**: "The greatest among you will be your servant. For whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted." Matthew 23:11-12
 - Jesus is saying something that challenges the way we expect things to work. **How do you react to Jesus' words here?**
- Eddie closed his message by saying this: "Friend, you and I were made for this: to become less and less, so that Jesus can be more and more." **How does this challenge you today?**
- Is there anything else from the message that you want to explore more this week?

Daily Time With God Debrief (25 minutes)

- Was there a Scripture from Colossians that stood out to you as you read this week?
- What is one thing you want to apply or put into practice from your Bible reading this week? (Use your SOAP notes to look back.)
- Did you write down anything on your gratitude list that you'd be willing to share?
- Is there a moment this week where you noticed God with you or at work in your ordinary life? What was it?
